A. Mobile Food Ordinance:

B. Solar Energy Systems Ordinance:

The information she is looking for is potential health hazards from all the pesticides and herbicides that they use that will be going into the ground and into the water and this putting a burden on the taxpayers when the clean up needs to be done. Arin also states that she is working on a petition.

Bruce asked for definition of village district: Brandon defined it as Jay town line, the river and down to the shuy corner.

Bruce states we have outgrown our ordinance which states no more then three facilities within the village district, this ordinance would be going forward no more than three which means if a business closes doors another can not open and the business which are already operating would be grandfathered.

Roger stated he has started a petition also in line with the limited Marijuana facilities of not more then three within the district limits. Jim states again, all petitions will be considered.
